

CONGRESS MOTIONS:

Motions for discussion at the Congress Business Meeting must be in the hands of the General Secretary at least **five months** before the date set for Congress.

This means motions must reach General Secretary (address at the front of this magazine) by 10TH MARCH 2014.

Will Secretaries of ISF Member Organisations please do their best to ensure, that the Board /Committee have an opportunity to discuss possible motions for the ISF Congress at their next meeting. Many organisations hold Board or Committee meetings infrequently and as a result sometimes miss the deadline for submitting motions.

Motions can be on any relevant subject and motions which give an opportunity for delegates to discuss the direction of the Federation in the future will be particularly welcome.

REPRESENTATION:

If you are an ISF individual member and also a member of one of the organisations affiliated to the ISF, you could offer to represent your organisation at the ISF Congress 2014, as an appointed delegate or proxy you can vote on their behalf at the Business Meeting.

COMMITTEE ELECTIONS:

A postal ballot will be held in 2014 to elect Officers and Committee Members to the Executive Committee of the ISF. Results will be announced at the General Meeting to be held on 3rd August 2014 during our Congress week at the Eastbourne Centre, Eastbourne, UK

Nominations for the Executive Committee members must be in the hands of the Elective Auditors before 29th January 2014

(Nomination forms for Individual Members and Organisations will be enclosed in this

edition of "YF")

Nominees to send their electoral statement to the General Secretary by the 29th of February 2014 to ensure that it can placed in the electoral booklet that is to be sent out to all members along with their voting papers at the beginning of May 2014.

Postal votes must be in the hands of the Elective Auditors before 14th July 2014

To be eligible for nomination, candidates must have been an individual member for a period of at least 2 years prior to the Biennial General Meeting. Candidates must also be nominated by at least one affiliated body or 2 individual members.

Before nomination, please make sure that your candidate is willing to stand.

SPECIAL NOTICES FOR CONGRESS 2014

On a special order motion by Robin Hodson, Steve Vogel seconding, the EC unanimously agreed that, in order to promote the organisational efficiency of the ISF, the EC has sought to reduce the number of EC members from 12 to 9 by eliminating the 3 of the five elected EC member positions due for election at the 2014 BGM."

The legal authority to make such changes is granted to the Committee by Article 8. "Bye-Laws," that states in part the following:

- a) The Committee may make, amend or repeal Bye-Laws;
- b) Any new Bye-Law or amendment to an existing Bye-Law shall cease to have effect unless ratified by members in general meeting at the General Meeting immediately subsequent to the making of such Bye-Laws;"

The Executive Committee Members, whose term of office concludes in 2014 are Matthias Güldenstein, Bill Parkins, Steve Vogel, Kris Einarsdottir and Graham Connolly. The three elected EC-member positions the EC identified to be withdrawn are those occupied by: Matthias Güldenstein, who is standing down and not seeking re-election; Steven Vogel, who is not seeking re-election but is willing to continue as the appointed Minutes Secretary, the vacancy that already exists on the committee. The extant Bye-Law so amended is Bye-Law C-1.a) that states:"1. Constitution of the Executive Committee

The Committee shall comprise: a) A President, a Vice-President and five members elected by the members;" changed by the above Committee action to read as follows: " a) A President, a Vice-President and three members elected by the members;"

Since in Helsinki a motion was placed to committee to eliminate 3 EC positions (as in this YF), to be ratified in Eastbourne in 2014, we will not be bringing new By Laws to the members until after that is decided upon. In the meantime however members who have an interest in the By Laws for the future should give thought to: size of committee; elimination of positions; should all positions be elected versus appointed; do you wish to see representation from regions of the membership or any other suggestions. In her gallery, she has work by ISF artists Coral Ryder, Ulla Alvarsdotter, Colin Hall, Matthias Güldenstein, and ISF students from Iceland and Finland.





Cober Hill is a place of beauty and inspiration, situated near the picturesque seaside town of Scarborough and the North Yorkshire Moors National Park overlooking the stunning Heritage Coast.

The village of Cloughton is just 6 miles north of Scarborough and 15 miles south of Whitby on the A171 Scarborough to Whitby Road. (point of interest: Whitby is a well known town featured in books, cinema and television, most famously in Bram Stokers Dracula).

The entrance to Cober Hill is 100 yards along the Staintondale road. There are excellent road links from York and Leeds via the A64, to the A1/M1 via the A64, to the M62 via Driffield and via the A171 to Teesside. Manchester, Leeds/Bradford, Humberside and Teesside airports are all within easy travelling distance as well as the North Sea Ferries at Hull. There is frequent rail services linking Manchester, York and Hull to Scarborough, with half hourly bus services from Scarborough to Cloughton.


